

Hello Everyone,

I hope you are all is having a fantastic summer. It has been warm here in Wisconsin for the last couple of weeks, so I have been scrambling to make sure I always have a cold drink nearby. The Dominican Republic has felt that same type of weather but for the whole month and lots of rain. Hopefully, the kids down there are enjoying their summer vacation as they prepare for school to be back in session next September.

The board and I have really been working hard to make changes to the Hands of Hope organization over the first half of the year. We believe the organization had tried to do too much outside of the scope of what Hands of Hope was intended to do, which is to help the kids in our program grow in health, education, and faith. We are now working to get back the roots of why we started the program.

The sponsorship program is the primary way we help the kids of the program. This giving enables us to directly affect the child by having educational programs and having workers in the community that talk directly with the families of the sponsored children. We also provide need items like backpacks and Christmas food boxes. We still need more sponsors as we have over twenty kids that are waiting to be sponsored. Next is community involvement. This has previously been done through projects, which has been a great opportunity, but limited time for our involvement and are frequently costly. We are starting to try new projects, with older kids and young adults in the community. We are hiring them for projects and to work in the education center. Many of them are sponsored children, which shows others how important sponsorship is.

Lastly, we are working on creating a better connection between the local ministries and our kids. Our kids go to Bible class and love it, but frequently they do not have a home church. Sometimes it is because of distance, but often it is because they do not have a connection to the local church. We are working on ways to strengthen the bond between our programs and the local church.

Finally, I want to thank High Point Church in Madison. They have been extremely gracious with resources as I have transitioned to the role over the last year. Thank you for your partnership.

### **New Buildings in Arroyo Indio**

We have a new building in Arroyo Indio. That is some of the children of Arroyo Indio, their magnificent teacher and our awesome leader in the DR, Ana, on the first page. As some of you may know, a few months back the building that we were renting in Arroyo Indio was going to be sold so we could no longer use that space. Graciously, there was another vacant building nearby. This building is about 10 times the size of the one we were previously in and has a 30-meter yard for outside activities. The owner of the building allowed us to use it for a few months' rent free. The building does need some repairs and updates to the electrical system. The owner is going to or has already done much of the repairs that were needed. Praise God for his perfect timing!






It may seem early to think about school again, but we are gearing up for next year to get the supplies to our sponsor children on time.
